Chameleons are lizards. They can change the color of their skin. There are many species of chameleons. Some change colors if they are excited or scared.

Chameleon eyes can look in two directions at once. Like a camera, they can zoom in to see things more clearly.

Chameleons have long, sticky tongues. They have two groups of toes on each foot to help them grasp branches. Some species also have long, curled tails. The tails wrap around branches for balance.

Chameleons live alone. They often live in trees or bushes. They eat mostly insects. The largest types of chameleons eat birds and other lizards.
