Quokka

Quokkas are **native** to the little tip of southwest Australia. They also live on Rottnest Island.













A quokka has a small, rounded body. Its ears are also small and round. Its **snout** ends with a black nose.







Quokkas do not look very fast. But their short legs and large feet allow them to move quickly with ease.









Some countries spell words differently. In Australia, we spell it *grey*





Quokkas have sharp claws. They can use their claws to protect themselves.







Food

Quokkas sleep during the day. At night, they look for food. They often eat grasses, leaves, fruits, and berries.

More Facts

- Quokkas look adorable with their large eyes and smiles.
 But they are still wild animals. Getting too close to one could leave you with a bite or scratch.
- Quokkas do not need to drink much water. They can get most of the water they need from the plants they eat.
- An early Dutch traveler first thought the Quokka was a large rat. That's why the island they are found on is named Rottnest. The word is Dutch for "rat's nest."

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Glossary

coarse - having a rough texture.

female – an animal that produces eggs or gives birth to live young.

joey - the young of certain marsupials.

marsupial – an animal in a group of mammals that includes kangaroos and opossums. Female marsupials have a pouch outside their belly where the mother carries her young. native - a plant or animal naturally found in a place.

snout - the front part of an animal's head that sticks out. It includes the nose, mouth, and jaws.

unique - being the only of its type.
